Episode 2 Overview



Materials Needed

- Paper
- Pens
- Colored Pencils
- Markers
- Phone
- Sticky Notes
- Cardboard
- Dice x2
- Small Objects from Home

For this activity, you will become journalists and learn about other cultures!

We live in a world where we meet and interact with people from different communities and countries. Interview your partner for 5 minutes and ask them questions about their country and culture. *Here are some questions you can ask:*

What are some habits or customs that you do in everyday life?

How are festivals celebrated?

What is a popular song or movie in your country?

What is the most popular sport?



Discuss with your partner what you learned from the interviews!

Activity 2

If There Were No Differences

What would the world look like if there were no differences?

Think about and discuss the following three questions. You can even draw your answers!

1) What would the world look like without differences?

2) What would be the benefits of living in a world like that?

3) What would be the challenges?

Share your answers with your friends afterwards!

Time to create your very own logotypes and slogans!

Logotype

is a **graphic representation** or symbol often uniquely designed for ready recognition.

Slogan

Is a memorable **phrase** used as a repetitive expression of an idea or purpose



1. What are some examples of logos that you are familiar with? What makes them successful? Some popular logos:



2. Think and discuss about what describes your partner's country, its people, its landscapes, customs, art etc. and what would be the best symbol to show its identity.
3. Based on your interviews and what you have learned, you and your partner will create a logo and slogan that represents their country.

Present your logotypes & slogans to your friends!

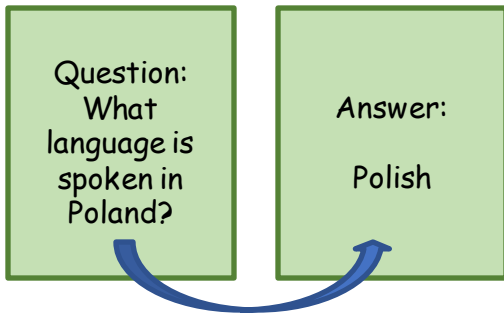
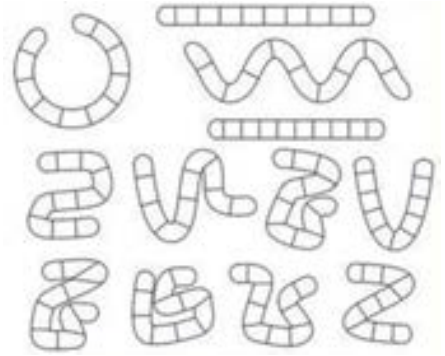
TIP: Don't take critiques personally. Be open-minded to the opinions of others and experiment with the suggested changes.

Activity 4

Creating Your Own Board Game

Today, we will be creating a board game about the world!

1. First, you will make the game board using a big piece of cardboard. Create 20 squares using different colors. These are some examples of shapes you can follow.
2. Each player should select a color and color in some of the squares on the board game.



3. Next, using a smaller cardboard, you will make 5 cards for each color. On each card, you will draw or write questions about different countries (with the answers on the back).

You can write questions about the countries you and your partner are from, but also include questions about different countries as well.

How to play:

1. To play, start by collecting small objects around the house such as rocks for counters. Alternatively, you can create small counters by drawing characters, family members etc.
2. Place counters at the starting point. Roll the dice and take that many steps on your board (The youngest starts).
3. Pick the card for the color you landed on and answer the question.
4. If you get it right, you will jump 1 space. If it's wrong, you will have to go back 2 spaces.

The person who reaches the end first wins!

Grab your friends and take a selfie together to celebrate your friendship!



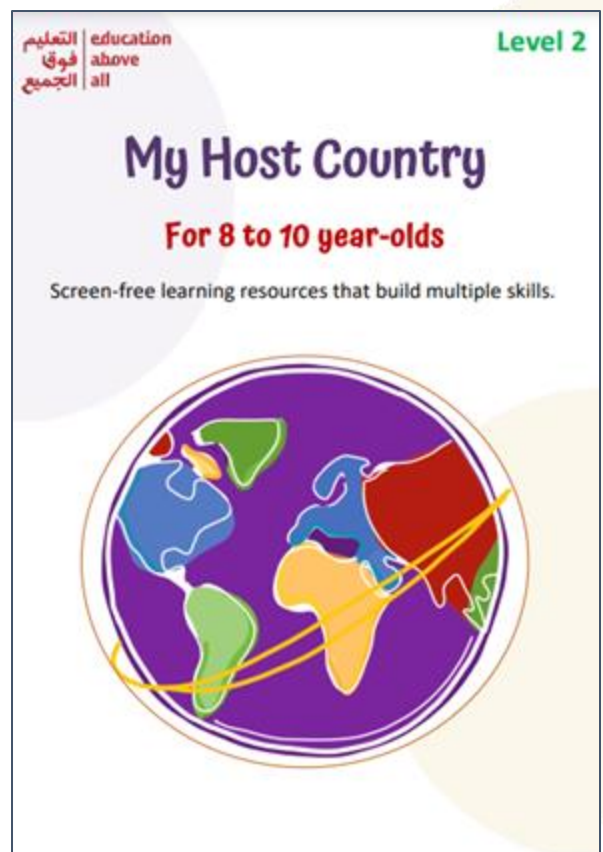
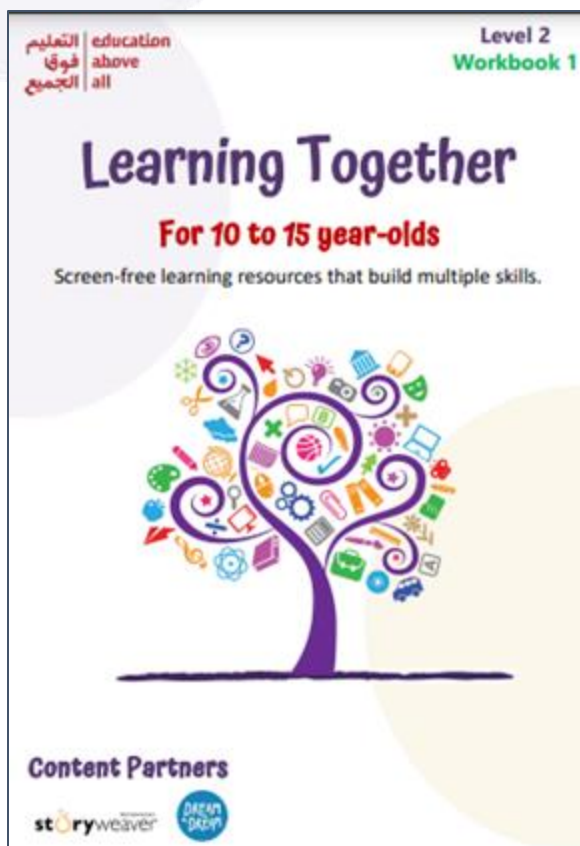
